It was a wonderful sight this week to see so many smiling families coming back into school after what I hope has been a magical summer even if the sun only really appeared when we came back! The children have settled straight in, happy and engaged which is our primary aim.

The preschool has had a significant makeover during the summer as I am sure those of you who have already started have seen. The sandpit is a big hit and the sensory room really does add a new dimension to the provision. Thank you to all who supported the fundraising last year.

You will remember that the inspectors visited us on 16th and 17th May this year, completing their first full inspection since 2009. The process of inspection and conduct of the team was wholly unacceptable and for this reason we filed our complaints and as a result we are only now able to share the report. Much of the verbal feedback that was given to the senior leadership team does not feature in the report and we are disappointed about this as the report is little more than two pages and doesn't capture even a fraction of the glowing praise many areas of our school received.

The personal development of our pupils and the ambition we have for our pupils, demonstrated through the challenging curriculum was a significant strength. The inspection team picked out many subjects that were very strong and the leadership at all levels from governance to pupil leadership was also highlighted as a strength of the school. Naturally we were disappointed that these were not graded as outstanding however, the feedback that we receive everyday and through our annual surveys together with the incredible progress our children make in all areas are the barometer that we will continue to measure ourselves by. On behalf of the whole team here at The Quinta, I would like to thank you again for your tremendous support and look forward to another happy and rewarding year here at school.

Key Information

Behaviour

You may have been told already by your child about some of the changes we have been making to our behaviour and relationships policy. This year we will be contacting parents less about incidents involving your child unless we feel they are significant. By significant we mean we will always inform you if your child has been deliberately injured by another child and if your child will be spending time in reflection. The aim is to build stronger relationships with parents by lessening the number of times we need to contact you over negative behaviour that can easily be dealt with in school. Other changes include removing team points and replacing them with class points meaning children still work as a team to achieve an outcome but are rewarded in a much more bespoke and meaningful way. The full behaviour policy will be sent out next week including a one page overview and child friendly version.

School Meal Price Increase from September

As you will know, we make every effort to support the needs of all of our pupils and their families but unfortunately from September we are having to increase our school meal prices to £2.50.

Please be assured that we have considered all options to keep the costs down, but due to the current economic climate it has left us with no choice but to increase the price for the first time in four years aligning us with other schools in the local area. We hope that you understand and we look forward to supplying your children with the same high standard of school meals.

Key Assessment Dates

Attendance all year round is extremely important for your child's well being and progress however there are some key dates within the year that their attendance is imperative for national assessment, these dates are as follows:

- Key Stage One Phonics Screening Check w/c 10th June 2024
- Key Stage One SATs throughout May 2024
- Year 4 Multiplication Check within the two week period commencing 3rd June
- Key Stage 2 SATs Week Monday 13th until Thursday 16th May

Reminders

Nut allergies - We have a large number of children with severe nut allergies. We are a nut free school so please ensure all packed lunches and snacks are nut free.

PE Kit - Please remember that your child can come to school in their P.E. kits for P.E. days. You should have had a note on Seesaw to let you know when your child has P.E. This is different in the reception classes. The children will have their P.E. kits in school to change into.

Attendance - Holidays in Term Time

This year we are looking to improve even further with attitudes to learning. Within attitudes to learning we include attendance. Last year our overall attendance was well above the national averages and this contributed to our most successful year for pupil performance. We did not issue any fixed penalty notices last year due to the national disruption and the isolated cases that fell within this permissible action. With teacher strikes and additional bank holidays it felt disingenuous to then fine for a few days over. However this year we will be issuing FPNs for unauthorised absence over 10 sessions (5 days)

We advise parents/carers to avoid taking children out of school in term time. Holidays taken in term time will not be authorised. If parents/carers decide to take child/children out of school, please call into the school office for a Leave of Absence form to be completed - this is so that we can accurately identify where a child is. Where we believe a child has been on holiday when we have been told they are on holiday we reserve the right to ask for medical evidence or fine.

Please remember that taking your child out of school without the school's authorisation may result in the school requesting the Local Authority to issue a Fixed Penalty Notice to each parent/carer for each child. The penalties are shown below.

Please be aware that only a few days of absence can impact significantly on a child's attendance percentage and consequently the child's education and learning. Missing one week per school year is the same as missing half a term of primary education - 140 lessons. 60% of primary aged pupils who missed more than 19 days did not achieve the expected standard in 2019.

Holidays exceeding 10 or more sessions will result in a fixed penalty notice as explained below.

There are some excellent orchestral tutors booked onto the course and the Saturday will finish with a short concert from 6:30pm in the Trinity Church, Congleton.



CREATIVE DANCE WITH SOPHIE

Creative Dance for Early Years is an innovative dance syllabus, created by Rambert Grades. Each dance class will take the children on an imaginative journey with endless themes. An energetic warm up is followed by physical skills development as the children learn structured movement material. Creative intuition is encouraged with a closing creative exploration to dive deep into their imagination. Swimming with whales, flying rockets to the moon or adventuring through the desert- every class is different.
