Letter from the Immunisations Team below regarding Econsent...

The Quinta Primary School session date is Tuesday 17th October 2023

The children's nasal spray flu vaccine is safe and effective. It's offered every year to children to help protect them against flu.

Flu can be an unpleasant illness and can cause serious complications. Children can catch and spread flu easily. Vaccinating your child also protects vulnerable family members and friends.

The vaccination is free and is a quick, simple, and painless spray up the nose. Even if your child had the vaccine last year, types of flu can vary, so it is recommended to have it annually to maximise protection. Since the flu vaccine programme was introduced, most children offered the vaccine in schools have received the flu nasal spray annually.

The School Aged Immunisations Team will only vaccinate children with a valid E-consent form.

For more information about the nasal spray flu vaccine please read the online leaflet: Protecting your child against flu. This leaflet includes information about the small number of children for whom the nasal spray vaccine is not appropriate for. Further information can also be found on the NHS website.

PUPILS STARTING SECONDARY SCHOOL - SEPTEMBER 2024

According to our records, your child is due to start secondary school in September 2024. I am writing to inform you that the application process opened on 1 September. To apply, you need to complete your 'home' local authority's application form (i.e., the authority where you live), even if you plan to apply for a place in a school in another local authority. It is very important to remember to submit your application by the closing date of 31 October 2023.

Please Note: If your child has an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) you should have received a separate letter from the SEND Team explaining the secondary transfer process. Therefore, please disregard this letter. If you have any queries, please contact the SEND team by email to senteameast@cheshireeast.gov.uk.

Most Cheshire East residents choose to **apply online at** <u>Parent Portal: Home (cheshireeast.gov.uk)</u>. Applying online is quick and easy. Feedback has shown that one of the main advantages is that you can view your offer online on the published offer date of 1 March 2023, rather than waiting for a letter to be received in the post. We would suggest that you follow @CE_Admissions or @FISCheshireEast on Twitter and / or Family Information Service (Cheshire East Council) on Facebook for information and reminders.

We would strongly advise you to apply for 3 schools. These should be ranked on your application form in order of preference. Most Cheshire East parents do receive their first preference school but if we are unable to offer your first preference school then we will seek to offer your second or third preference. All preferences are treated equally, and no priority is given to applications simply because only one preference is given. If you are applying for a place at a faith school, you may need to complete a supplementary information form (SIF). Please check the school website for information about this or contact the school.

If an application is received **after the closing date of 31 October 2023**, it will be considered late and processed after all on-time applications and can therefore be disadvantaged. Only in exceptional circumstances can we consider late applications alongside those received on-time. You must therefore provide reasons for consideration at the time of the application.

If there are any changes in circumstances that may affect your application, for example, a change of address please contact the admissions team as soon as possible.

Full details about the application process and information booklets are published online at Application process for starting school in September (cheshireeast.gov.uk). Parents are asked to think about how their child will travel to school when making their preferences. Cheshire East is committed to working with schools to encourage pupils to walk, cycle, use public transport or car share where possible. 

Reminders

Nut allergies - We have a large number of children with severe nut allergies. We are a nut free school so please ensure all packed lunches and snacks are nut free.

PE Kit - Please remember that your child can come to school in their P.E. kits for P.E. days. You should have had a note on Seesaw to let you know when your child has P.E. This is different in the reception classes. The children will have their P.E. kits in school to change into.

Attendance - Holidays in Term Time

This year we are looking to improve even further with attitudes to learning. Within attitudes to learning we include attendance. Last year our overall attendance was well above the national averages and this contributed to our most successful year for pupil performance. We did not issue any fixed penalty notices last year due to the national disruption and the isolated cases that fell within this permissible action. With teacher strikes and additional bank holidays it felt disingenuous to then fine for a few days over. However this year we will be issuing FPNs for unauthorised absence over 10 sessions (5 days)

We advise parents/carers to avoid taking children out of school in term time. Holidays taken in term time will not be authorised. If parents/carers decide to take child/children out of school, please call into the school office for a Leave of Absence form to be completed - this is so that we can accurately identify where a child is. Where we believe a child has been on holiday when we have been told they are on holiday we reserve the right to ask for medical evidence or fine.

Please remember that taking your child out of school without the school's authorisation may result in the school requesting the Local Authority to issue a Fixed Penalty Notice to each parent/carer for each child. The penalties are shown below.

Please be aware that only a few days of absence can impact significantly on a child's attendance percentage and consequently the child's education and learning. Missing one week per school year is the same as missing half a term of primary education - 140 lessons. 60% of primary aged pupils who missed more than 19 days did not achieve the expected standard in 2019.

Holidays exceeding 10 or more sessions will result in a fixed penalty notice as explained below.

Children on Social Media The Quinta Primary has a presence on Facebook, Twitter and Instagram, if you do not wish for any images of your child to be used on these platforms please let the School Office know.

Coats Your child will be outside if it's raining. If they do not bring a coat to school they will be wet. Children will have the option to stay under the lodge, shelter under the key stage 1 classrooms or under the hall canopy. Children will only be inside if the temperature is unbearably cold.

Healthy School Snacks

Snacks play a major part in children's diets. Here are ideas for healthy snacks for children in the classroom and afterschool programs:

Fruits and vegetables

Dried Fruit – raisins, dried apricots, dried mango.

Healthy Grains - bread, crackers, cereal bars

Dairy – yogurt, cheese

Children will be told to put unhealthy snacks back in their lunchboxes if they are seen eating them at playtime. **Bread, fruit, vegetables and dairy are permitted**. Crisps, chocolate, sweets and *cakes are not permitted. The school occasionally allows unhealthy treats such as cake as part of fundraising or celebration days. You will be notified of these days.

Drinks in school

Please can you ensure your child has water in their bottle. There are occasions where some children will only drink water with cordial and if this is the case then exceptions can be made. However, if your child brings energy drinks, carbonated drinks or other branded bottles, they will be given them back at the end of the day to take home. Children have access to water to fill up during the day.

Here at The Quinta we pride ourselves on how smart all our students present themselves everyday. As we approach half term we would like to politely remind parents to ensure the correct school uniform is used - no trainers with uniform, remember ties and correct PE kit.



SEND Support and Paperwork

Last week information was shared about the changes to high needs funding. Cheshire East's expectations around hours and paperwork at school level has also changed.

The school SEND stages are

<u>First Concerns:</u> These are written by class teachers. This is any child needing additional support or interventions from the class teacher or TA for 6 hours or more a week. The child can stay on this stage until their needs change where they can be removed or moved up.

<u>School Support Plan:</u> These are written by key adults and class TAs. This is for any child receiving over 12 hours additional support or intervention from the class teacher or TA but still requiring additional support. When a child gets to 20 hours or more additional support the school can apply for a Needs Assessment.

Now staff have spent three weeks with the children SEND paperwork will be started next week.




An ELSA is a specialist teaching assistant with a wealth of experience of working with children. ELSAs are trained and regularly supervised by the Educational Psychologists in your Local education authority. An ELSA is a warm and caring person who wants to help your child feel happy in school and to reach their potential educationally. Their aim is to remove the barriers to learning and to have happy children in school and at home.

Please do talk to the ELSA in your school if you have any problems with your child.









The ELSA will plan their sessions for your child very carefully. The session consists of several parts.

Emotional check in

This is an opportunity to talk about feelings,

Main activity

The ELSA will plan the activity to a learning objective. Something your child will be able to do at the end of the session that they cannot do now. This is usually a 'I can' statement such as 'I can tell you about my strengths' (A self-esteem objective). The ELSA will encourage your child to tell you about their talents or personal characteristics such as "kind", 'caring', 'helpful' or 'brave'. The child will then make something to reinforce those strengths.

Relaxation

Your child will be tought a relaxation exercise to help get them ready to go back to class

Your child will now be able to answer the question I can tell you about my strengths'



Group session

The ELSA will plan their sessions for your child very carefully. The session consists of several parts, the first two parts consists of a circle-time where children sit in a circle and take turns to speak.

Emotional check in

This is an opportunity to talk about feelings,

Warm up activity

A fun game or activity to help relax your child.

Main activity

This is similar to the individual session but your child will be encouraged to work with other children. This helps with co-operation, social skills, friendship and gives a sense of belonging. A learning objective will be set for the group of children which they will all be able to answer at the end of the session.

Typical problems



A very angry child

The ELSA will take the child through an anger management intervention to help them recognise their anger triggers, techniques to avoid those triggers and calming down techniques.

A loved pet has died

ELSAs are trained in bereavement and understand that the loss of a pet is probably the first experience of death for your child. They will work with your child to help them feel supported in school.

What Parents & Carers Need to Know about

AMONGUS

A multiplayer 'social deduction' game set in outer space, Among Us enjoyed a surge in popularity in 2020, and has since maintained a dedicated fan-base (globally, around 80 million regular players each month) thanks to its unique nature, simple premise and ease of access across numerous platforms. The game's on-screen action revolves around danger, disguise and deception – and there are certain parallels to be drawn with some of the real-life risks that parents and carers of young Among Us players need to be aware of.



WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

SENSITIVE

in Among Us, up to three players are secretly assigned to be allien imposters, tasked with murdering their colleagues while the sunvivors try to unmask them. While the concept's not far removed from traditional games like Wink Murder or TV shows such as The Traitors, some parents may feel uncomfortable about their child playing a video game in which deception and killing are prioritised.

VIRTUAL VIOLENCE

The an-screen death of characters may be fundamental to the gameplay of Among Us, but the majority of the animations depicting this are deliberately cartoonish and only appear very briefly. However, it is worth bearing in mind that the game has a PIGI age rating of 7 — meaning that certain elements (however heavily stylleed they may be) could still used to may occur players.

CHAT BETWEEN

With up to 15 people participating in each game enline, a large part of Among Us' appeal is speculating with fellow players who the imposters might be and making accusations. This dialogue through the in-game text chat can occasionally become heated – and could, of course, involve your child being put into contact with seople (including adults) who they



While Among Us prevides basic ways to communicate, many garners prefer to use external services such as Discord: a popular app which offers voice and video chat functions. These undeniably make cooperation easier, but also create a potential route for children to hear inappropriate language — or for strangers to message them privately in an environment which isn't resultated by the garne itself.

IN-GAME PURCHASES

Among Us is free to download an mobile devices, and costs less than £5 to obtain on console and PC. A related longer-term pitfall, though, is that the game also includes options to pay for upgrades such as removing ads on the mobile version or adding cosmetic touches to characters (euch as different costumes). It's certainly possible that a child could spend a significant sum without realising it.

Advice for Parents & Carers

CONSIDER SOFTER ALTERNATIVES

Although Among Us is hugely popular with young agmers, it's possible that some children might find the murder themes unsettling. It so, pienty of similar social deduction games are available (in bot digital and traditional board game formats) which downplay the potentially grisiler elements: some centre around undercover spies, for instance, and there's even a Marvel superhero-themed variant.

CHAT ABOUT CHATTING

You might feel it's prudent to talk to your child about the risks associated with voice chat while gaming, explaining in particular that strangers online aren't always who they claim to be. Keeping the conversation relaxed will reinforce your child's confidence that they can always come to you with any online concerns – not just about Among Us, but

DISCUSS DISCORD

In general, Discord is an excellent app for keeping online communities together because of its use of dedicated individual servers, which allow comprehensive control over who can join – and who can't. Once you're familiar with the platform, you could set up a secure server for your child and their friends to communicate during games of Among Us, with no access for people they den't know.

AMONG US, AMONG FRIENDS

When your child and their friends get together, they can enjoy a private game of Among Us by choosing a 'local' lobby - that is, only people connected to the same WiFi (your home network, for example) can enter. This prevents any random online users - who may be total strangers - from joining and removes the need for voice chat, as the players are all physically in the same location.

STOP SURPRISE SPENDING

If you're concerned about the possibility of your child racking up an unexpected bill on Among Us' microtransactions, you could consider using a prepaid card with a set limit. Likewise, you could specify in the game's options that adult authorisation is required for every purchase — or you could make sure that no payment methods are enabled on the device that your child plays the aams on.











