#### The National Dental Survey of 5 Year Olds

Every year The Office for Health Improvement and Disparities (OHID) and Cheshire East Local Authority collect information on the health of peoples' teeth. This is called a dental survey and the information helps to plan NHS dental services in your area.

This year the survey is collecting information about the health of the teeth of children aged 5 years old (as at 4th December 2023). Parents/carers of the children that have been invited to take part in the study have been emailed and a paper consent form has been sent home via the child.

If you wish for your child to take part the dental team will have a quick look at your child's teeth in school on Monday 4th December. This only takes a few minutes, new gloves and clean mirrors will be used for each child and no treatment will be provided. If you feel that your child will be nervous you are welcome to come along and your child will not be forced to have a check if they do not want to.

Please can we ask that all consent forms are completed and returned to school by Friday 10st December.




#### **Key Assessment Dates**


